

More than any generation before us, we are preoccupied with love. Isn't it after all the most individual of all emotions? Imagine we are wrong. And love isn't that personal at all, but the most common and universal of all emotions.

In Annelies Van Parys' song cycle Ah, cette Fable an angel is trapped by its mortal lover: if it stays on earth, it will die, if it takes wing, its lover won't survive. As this little tragedy unfolds, the Archive of Love starts to resonate with it. Words, sounds and feelings trigger associations and memories of previous passions, both sacred and profane. Echoes and fragments of other, older love songs attach themselves to this new tale, interrupt it and complement it, thus pushing the story into new directions.
